

Rachel McCulloch

Rachel McCulloch is the Rosen Family Professor of International Finance in the Department of Economics at Brandeis University. Prior to joining the Brandeis faculty in 1987, Dr. McCulloch taught at the University of Chicago, Harvard University, and the University of Wisconsin-Madison. In 2004-05, she was the AGIP Professor of International Economics at the Bologna Center of the Johns Hopkins School of Advanced International Studies. Dr. McCulloch currently serves on the Academic Advisory Council of the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston and the Advisory Committee of the Peterson Institute for International Economics, Washington, D.C. She has also been a consultant to the Asian Development Bank and the World Bank, and a member of the Technology Assessment Advisory Council of the U.S. Congressional Office of Technology Assessment (1979-87), the President's Commission on Industrial Competitiveness (1984-85), and the Committee on International Relations Studies with the People's Republic of China (1984-92). Dr. McCulloch holds a Ph.D. in economics from the University of Chicago.
